
What is the Purpose of ARG?

- To ensure that Arran receives appropriate support, as identified.


Community Survey

Positivity About Arran's Community Pulling Together




Support and Information Received:




- 77% of our residents felt that information received was good, with no complaints.
- Support was varied and often confusing to access.


Mental Health




Physical Health




Optimism on Arran's Environment

Ouputs:

900 responses: 35,000+ quantitative responses: 1,400+ qualitative responses

- Health is key priority
- The fear of uncertainty was felt in equal measures by residents who were suffering financially and those suffering physically.
- People recognise value of, and want to feel more positive about, tourism.
- Concerns about job security and family affecting mental health
- Lockdown has improved Arran's environment.

- Health of island community is at forefront:
 - Safe: Responsible: Welcoming
- Work with Scottish Government, North Ayrshire Council and Highlands & Islands Enterprise to determine best approach for Arran.
